Registration Forms received with incorrect fees will be returned. Due to limited seating, second choices are encouraged for class selections. Registration confirmations will be mailed within 3 business days of receipt of Registration Forms.

Cancellation & Refund Policy. If an event is canceled by the Quilt Walk Committee, a full refund will be made to the person completing the Registration Form. Full refunds will be made if you cancel your confirmed reservation and it is received not later than March 1, 2010. NO REFUNDS will be made for cancelations received subsequent to March 1, 2010. There are no rain dates. All cancelations shall be submitted in writing to the address above.

QUILT SHOW CATEGORIES

- 100 Large pieced: Made and quilted by the same person. Total measurement of all sides is more than 288" and 50% pieced.
- 200 Medium pieced: As #100, except total measurement of all sides is between 160" and 288".
- 300 Small pieced: As #100, except total measurement of all sides is less than 160".
- 400 Appliqued medium-large: Made and quilted by the same person. At least 50% appliqué. Total measurement of all sides greater than 160".
- 500 Appliqued small: As #400, except total measurement of all sides is less than 160".
- 600 Group quilts small/medium: Made by three or more persons. Includes all techniques. Total measurement of all sides greater than 160".
- 700 Group quilts large: As #600, except total measurement of all sides is more than 288" and 50% pieced.
- 800 Miniature: Pieced or appliquéd. A scaled down version of a full-sized quilt or wall hanging. It should be no wider than 24" or longer than 24".
- 900 Other techniques: Includes yo-yo, whole cloth, heavily embellished, collages, embroidered, cathedral window, etc.
- 1000 Young quilters Under 13: Includes all above categories.
- 1001 Young quilters 13 and older: Includes all above categories.
- 1002 Best use of a floral fabric

ENTRY RULES FOURTH ANNUAL LAKE CITY QUILT WALK March 25 – 28, 2010

- 2. Registration Forms must be received by March 1, 2010. Forms received subsequent to that date will not be accepted or processed.
- 3. A separate Registration Form must be submitted for each entry, Quilt Show or Quilt Walk.
- 4. Registration Forms may be photocopied.
- 5. The Registration Fee is \$5.00 for Quilt Show entries and \$1.00 for Quilt Walk entries and must be accompanied with the Registration Form. Registration Forms received without the correct entry fee will be considered disqualified for entry. Make checks payable to Lake City Quilt Walk and mail to: Lake City Quilt Walk Committee, c/o Amygene's Embroidery Studio, 218 N. Marion Ave, Lake City, FL 32055
- 6. Entries requiring return shipping must include cost of postage and insurance.
- 7. All quilts must have a sleeve with a 4" opening on the back for hanging.
- 8. The sleeve on large quilts must be 90 inches from the bottom edge.
- 9. All quilts must have a cloth label with the owner's name sewn on the back lower corner.
- 10. Each entry must be in an individual pillowcase with the owner's name and address permanently attached to the case.
- 11. Due to space considerations, the Quilt Walk Committee reserves the right to limit the number of quilts exhibited in the Show.
- 12. Entries will remain hanging in the Show until 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 27, 2010. Quilt Walk entries will remain hanging in the various locations until Monday, March 29, 2010.
- 13. Quilt Show entries may be picked up between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 27, 2010 at the First Baptist Church Fellowship Hall. Proof of ownership must be presented. It is suggested and recommended that a photocopy of the Registration Form be made and used as proof.
- 14. Entries being returned by mail will be mailed by April 1, 2010.
- 15. Quilt Walk entries may be picked up at Amygene's Embroidery Studio starting on Tuesday, March 30. Proof of ownership must be presented.
- 16. Registration Forms must be received by March 1, 2010. Forms received subsequent to that date will not be accepted or processed.
- 17. A separate Registration Form must be submitted for each entry, Quilt Show or Quilt Walk.
- 18. Registration Forms may be photocopied.

Stress Free, Tool Free Paper Piecing.....\$30.00

Make paper pieced blocks with no stress, strain or special tools. It's fun and very easy! A variety of patterns will be used in class. Kit Fee: \$7.00

In this failing economy we are looking for a bargain. I find lot of good buys at consignment shops, thrift stores and how abouts our own closet.

If we just know how to alter a few things we can make our garments look “*Street Chic*” and not thrift store finds or hand me downs. In this class you will learn how to:

- Mark and measure
- Ironing, pressing, seaming
- Hems (pants, skirts, sleeves)
- Waists (let out, drop the waistband)
- Shoulders seams – sloping shoulders, narrowing the shoulder, taking out shoulder pads
- Hips and thighs, and the seat in pants
- How to cut down a collar, shorten a sleeve length from the shoulder
- How to work with different types of fabric
- Make your garment look fresh and up to date

Quilt Block Pillow or One Pillow Three Ways..... \$60.00

Today pillows are so expensive but you can easily make them yourself. Changing pillows in a room is one of the easiest ways to give your décor a lift and lift your spirits in the process. We'll get started with a basic pillow that can be varied to change the mood of your room.

The center square of this square in square pillow will be embellished with your choice of a monogram, decorative stitching, or free motion design.

You will have enough materials included in your kit to make one pillow for your future inspiration.

Your machine must be in good working order. For the monogram center you must have a machine capable of embroidery and bring your chosen monogram loaded in your machine and ready to stitch out. The monogram should be no larger than 1 ½" in height and 5" in length to fit the center square.

For the free motion center you must know how to drop the feed teeth/dogs on your sewing machine.

For the decorative stitched center you must have some decorative stitches available on your sewing machine.

Material List: Basic sewing supplies, Neutral sewing thread, Standard sewing foot, Zipper foot, Piecing foot, Cording foot or single welt foot, Free motion spring foot or free motion foot you are comfortable with, Walking foot(optional), Embroidery 90/14 needle for use with blendables thread, Size 80/12 needle for piecing.
